All Those Years

Deuteronomy 6:6–7: "And these words that I command you today shall be on your heart. You shall teach them diligently to your children, and shall talk of them when you sit in your house, and when you walk by the way, and when you lie down, and when you rise."

My friend Debbie's two daughters were in high school when she experienced severe flu-like symptoms. Debbie visited her family doctor, who told her the flu bug had passed her by. Broken Chains Ministry Update

On March 2nd, I received an invitation for our group to return to ministry in the Finney County Jail after a year of being restricted from visiting due to Covid-19. We were asked to meet with the male inmates who are newest to the jail—as they are quarantined for 14 days when they enter. So, since we visit on the first and third Sundays of each month, we work with a new group of men each time. We spend one hour bringing them a worship service—including music, scripture, and a message--followed by small group discussion time. We end our time by praying individually for each man.

Coming Updates and Changes

The Trustees are looking forward to a productive remainder of the year. There are lots of projects coming your way, but two of the most exciting revolve around the sanctuary video system and the television monitors that will begin appearing by the first of May. The cameras and video equipment that will be installed toward July will enhance both the worship experience within the sanctuary and the worship quality for the ever-increasing home church member. The number of people attending church has been steadily growing, but so have the numbers of people that watch at home in real-time by live streaming or later through YouTube or the church Facebook page. The Media Team was created by our Staff Parish Relations Committee last year to tackle this issue again and they did a great job nailing down the details. Those servants among us, including the nursery staff, ushers and even those in the Welcome Center or Fellowship Hall will finally be able to enjoy the worship service via TV monitor while performing their chosen duties or during spillover times when larger-than-capacity numbers are expected.

The conversations and planning revolving around both projects go back more than a decade, but the timing and the budget were never right at the same time and they were shelved more than once. Now that COVID is in remission and the evangelistic need for reaching out is increasing, the timing is right. With the incredible gift that the Charles Norwood Trust gave to the church, we can finish this project without using budgeted funds. Our preference is always to favor ministry over maintenance from the budget standpoint, so that tithed money remains largely missional. When we have unbudgeted money to work with, it allows for necessary repairs and upgrades without affecting the daily operation of the church: a win-win.

One huge accomplishment this year, thanks to you, was paying off the building loan from the Welcome Center project. The church is once again debt-free! So, rather than paying down a loan, we are looking outside ourselves for where God wants us to serve next. It is an extremely exciting time in the life of our church.

You can look forward to some freshening up of Sunday school rooms, energy-saving improvements with LED lighting and some work on the kitchens including a replacement of the ancient ice machine. Some of what needs done you may not see because it's steam-tunnel stuff like plumbing, but like any very large house, keeping everything running is a never-ending task.

Finally, if you notice something that needs attention, you are always welcome to stop by the office, email Jenny, or stop me in the hallway and let us know. We'd rather hear it twice and get it fixed than miss it once. The Trustees ultimately are responsible for anything in the church or both parsonages that you can touch. We have an excellent committee full of fellow church members that are dedicated to being the best stewards of the buildings entrusted to our care and making sure that your experience with your church is the very best it can be.






