FROM THE SENIOR PASTOR'S DESK THE STORM WILL CALM

One day Jesus said to his disciples, "Let us go over to the other side of the lake." So, they got into a boat and set out. As they sailed, he fell asleep. A squall came down on the lake, so that the boat was being swamped, and they were in great danger. The disciples went and woke him, saying, "Master, Master, we're going to drown!" He got up and rebuked the wind and the raging waters; the storm subsided, and all was calm. "Where is your faith?" he asked his disciples. In fear and amazement, they asked one another, "Who is this? He commands even the winds and the water, and they obey him." (Luke 8:22-25)

My First United Methodist Church, Garden City family, I greet you in the name of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ. I hope you are enjoying your summer vacations and travels. The weather has been quite warm in this part of the state. This reminds me of the unpredictable weather conditions in Western Kansas.

In the Gospel of Luke, we see Jesus traveling with His disciples in a boat across the sea, and they encounter a massive storm threatening to sink their boat. It is only when they called for Jesus that the storm became calm. There are many ways through which storms of life can confront us. Whenever you're in a storm, even though you may think at first that the Lord is not there, He is there! The first thing we must do in the storms of life is to affirm that Jesus is Lord, even over the storms.

As a congregation, we have our fair share of the storms ravaging through our denomination on the issue of human sexuality. The Special Session of the General Conference of the United Methodist Church in 2019 reaffirmed the Church's traditional position on this issue. This, however, was not received well by others in the Church. The groups on each side of this issue agreed for an amicable separation in what became known as "the Protocol." This Protocol was expected to be presented at the United Methodist Church General Conference earlier scheduled for August 2022, but later moved forward to 2024 because of Covid restrictions on delegates traveling from outside the US.

The moving forward of the General Conference to 2024 may have caused some on the traditional side of this issue to form a new denomination called The Global Methodist Church on May 1, 2022. Since then, some congregations disaffiliated from the United Methodist Church over the issue of human sexuality. At the recently held Great Plains Annual Conference Session in June, 12 congregations disaffiliated, and some more are expected by end of the year. It is within this broader context that I invite you to be in prayer to calm this storm causing division in our denomination. As a congregation, our Church Council decided not to discuss this issue until the General Conference meets in 2024. On July 24th of this year, I invited our District Superintendent, Zach Anderson, to address our congregation on the future of our denomination. I was pleased to have him here to answer some of the questions they had and feel this will help us as we figure out how to respond to this issue. Just like the disciples in the middle of a scary storm, the presence of Christ helped them navigate the dangerous waters. I invite you to be in prayer and in mutual respect of each other if our Church Council decides we can start these conversations.

From the story of Jesus calming the storm, may we remember what God has already done in our lives as some of the most important ways of maintaining our confidence and trust in God. As young David said to King Saul before going out to face Goliath, "God has saved me in the past and God will save me now." When we can shift our focus away from the current threat and back onto the power of God, we can conquer the fear that

threatens to paralyze us.

Friends, think for a moment about a storm that is threatening you or someone you love. Maybe it has been building for some time or maybe it is just rising in strength. I invite you to be in prayer as we figure out our next steps of faith. Let's not let what is happening in our denomination distract us from our vision as a congregation of being the hands and feet of Jesus Christ. Through this vision, *Charles Nyamakone*.

we speak to the broader mission of our denomination to go out into the world and make disciples of Jesus Christ (Matthew 28:19). Amen.

ASSOCIATE PASTOR'S REFLECTION BEING STILL IN A HECTIC WORLD

Be still and know that I am God... Psalm 46:10 (NIV)

Stillness may be seen as a practice of waiting with open hearts and mind, listening to a word from God. And, often, the response shows up in unlikely ways. While silence can be a part of the practice, stillness does not mean inaction. Stillness can occur in that connection that comes when washing dishes, as you look out the window, in taking a walk, in creating (i.e., cooking, needle-pointing, knitting, wood carving) or even repairing something. It can come in the waiting period of decisions about ministries, while fully engaged in serving. Stillness is a silent place, within us, that takes us away from doubts, fears, or worries, and instead, offers a few minutes to allow our minds to roam free as it connects with our surroundings, without requiring us to be actively engaged in changing the surroundings. It is in those moments that beautiful memories surface and answers are revealed. God speaks to us and settles our spirit.

In stillness, we also learn to let go. Somehow in those moments, without words or conscious thoughts, we often work through and work out things that may have been weighing heavily on our hearts. And, as we do so, we let go...of the burdens, the worries, the unsurety, even the need to control the outcome. The presence of the Holy Spirit speaks to us at a level that does not require our conscious awareness, and yet, we are connected to the Divine so deeply that we find moments of peace and restfulness that are often difficult to describe.

Yet, all too often, we fill our days and our times in ways that do not allow us the space to be still. The laundry list of tasks, often necessary ones, takes over, or we allow our aloneness to take over our quiet time, such that we lose the gift of stillness. We see so much urgency in the tasks ahead, that we miss the opportunity for stillness by focusing on the burden of the tasks, and not the gift of the moment.

So, my message of encouragement for us in the months to come, is to carve out space for stillness. Stillness to allow God to speak to us and grant us soul-deep healing. Stillness that will grant us the wisdom of knowing how to let go. Let go of all the "coulds" and "shoulds," so we are more present in the ways God has called us to be.

TECLA & TUTU VISIT ZIMBABWE!

This years' summer has been one with a difference. It was a great experience going back to Zimbabwe, Africa after six years in the US. We felt nothing but excitement after seeing our extended family waiting for us at the airport. We arrived at the airport in Harare, Zimbabwe on the 3rd of June. During our stay in Zimbabwe, we were driving up and down daily seeing family and friends that we hadn't seen for over six years.

We were driving so much that our local gas station employees knew we were their biggest customers. Besides seeing family and friends, we had projects that we wanted to accomplish before our 6-week vacation or visit was over. These included furnishing kitchen cabinets, thatching a hut, fencing the homestead at our small plot, and putting a tombstone on Tecla's late sisters' gravesite, who died 20 years ago. While in Zimbabwe, Tutu was putting in hundreds of hours on the road driving family from the village to different places. Tutu also enjoyed hiking on one of the biggest mountains in our village. People from the villages where the First UMC donated boreholes, are very excited and appreciate the clean water, which is nearer to them than before. We also enjoyed eating our home country's cuisine, which we had missed for a long time, as well as worshiping in our hometown. One of things that hurt us was failure to worship at our local United Methodist Church in the Nyamakope Village, because the sanctuary roof was extremely damaged by a hailstorm sometime last year. Both Pastor Charles & Tecla were raised from the Nyamakope United Methodist Church. Members of this congregation are currently holding worship under a big tree near the damaged sanctuary. SUMMER INTERN REFLECTION

I am grateful to do my Summer Internship at the First United Methodist Church of Garden City. The warm welcome I received was beyond what I could ever imagine. The whole process for me to come here has been amazing. So, I would like to thank all of you.

While preparing to come, until I got here, I knew the pastors and one staff member who interviewed me, accepted me, and the SPRC approved my arrival. When I got here, I noticed that many were ready to welcome me. It has been proven by the hospitality that all of you have expressed toward me. I feel at home. Through Ms. Jenny, I received gift cards for my various expenses, including lunches. Many of you have been taking me to restaurants, as well as visiting your farms. You gave me vehicles for transport, some gave me cash, and someone even paid for my flight ticket so that I could go and celebrate with my wife for her birthday, as well as you have hosted me. It is beyond what I could have ever imagined.

I have been active in the United Methodist Church since my childhood. I have served in various roles, including chairing the youth fellowship, the choir, and working with adults on different committees. However, I had no experience working with children – under 12 years old. During Vacation Bible School (VBS), it was my first experience ever working with children. I was not confident on the two first days, but on the three last days, since I was the only one that did Bible stories for all groups, I had no other option than to be confident. Thank God the kids were so great – they liked to listen to me, even though my accent could be challenging for them. The VBS experience, and time I have been with the youth, including accompanying them to Camp Horizon, have helped me understand the ministry with the young ones in the American context.

My internship here at the First United Methodist Church of Garden City is the kind of internship I was looking for. It helps one to be able to manage a local church. What I appreciate most about this internship is that it has allowed me to experience several different areas of a local church. I have been attending all meetings, such as staff, Endowment, Trustees, SPRC, Emergency/Disaster Team, Outreach & Evangelism, and the Church Council. It has been such a great opportunity to learn from these different committees and groups. I have also done some ministry work outside the church facility, such as visiting nursing homes, praying with the residents, and visiting some farms.

I have been learning a lot simply by spending time with Pastor Charles and Pastor Joel and paying attention to how they interact with church members and residents of nursing homes, how Miss Missy relates to the children and youth, and how chairpersons of different committees conduct meetings.

Serving as an intern at FUMC Garden City has also allowed me to have some connection with the Great Plains Annual Conference. In late May and early June, I attended the retreat of all interns at the Great Plains Annual Conference in Junction City. Since then, I have had peer group members with whom we meet weekly under the facilitation of some Conference Staff members.

Being an intern at FUMC Garden City has enabled me to have another experience of the United Methodist Church in the United States. I have visited some United Methodist Churches in other States in the US, and I found that FUMCGC also has some of its particularities. Some people in the Chicago area were surprised whenever they heard me saying, "I

will go to Garden City, Kansas, for my internship." I now see their positive surprise with all the beautiful things I have been experiencing here in Garden City and the FUMC in particular.

I will always remember my precious time at FUMC Garden City. Thank you, and God bless you!
